- The Experience- school leadership guides the work by tracking the data and offering relevant professional development and staff accountability.
- F.B.I. (*Families Being Involved*) Parent Academy- workshops to build capacity with parents to support learning at home and increase student achievement.
- Accelerated Reader—houses quizzes for thousands of books accessible to students after they read a book.
- Parent and Family Resource Center available Monday-Friday, 8:00 am 2:00 pm located in room 403.
- **Harper PTO** gives parents and teachers the opportunity to work together to supplement and enrich the educational experience.
- **Tutor.com** provide 24/7, on demand, 1-to-1 tutoring and homework help in more than 250 subjects.
- Attendance incentives—collaborate with community partners to provide gifts that promotes daily classroom promptness and presence.



Harper Elementary School is committed to frequent two-way communication with families about student learning. At Harper, students and parents will be provided frequent reports concerning their child's academic progress in the following ways:

- Teachers will post a minimum of two grades each week in every subject area for parents to review online through Infinite Campus.
- •Students with exemplar class work will have their papers displayed on bulletin boards and in the classroom to serve as a model for other student learners.
- •School-wide notices will be communicated to parents via flyers, school marquee, email, class DOJO, and our school's website.
- Parent-teacher conferences are held continuously throughout the school year face-to-face and virtually. During the conference, the teacher and student shall discuss the student's performance as it relates to the School-Parent Compact.
- •Parents may request a teacher conference at any time to discuss their child's achievement plan.

•Parents will have reasonable access to staff and opportunities to volunteer and observe in their child's class.

- Practice reading fluency drills, and ensure students choose books to match Lexile level.

- Communicate student progress to parents in a routine manner through written, oral and virtual dialogue.
- Provide daily reading checklist for comprehension and math family connections.
- Provide parents with a letter at the beginning of each unit in Reading/ELA, and Math to inform parents of the standards that will be covered.

•Provide reading and math strategies that will support learning at home.


Harper Elementary School <u>PARENTS</u> joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students success in all content areas.

- I will provide a place for my child to learn at home and encourage my child to read at least 30 minutes per day.
- Support my child's learning by allowing them to access technology at home to build proficiency in all content areas.
- I will attend parent-teacher conferences.
- I will attend **FBI (Families Being Involved)** workshops faceto-face and virtual to help improve how I will work with my child at home.
- Visit Harper's Parent and Family Resource Center to get materials and resources to help my child with reading and math at home.



Harper Elementary School <u>STUDENTS</u> joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school. Harper's students recommended the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

- I will take notes, participate during discussions, and complete all face-to-face and ELBC classroom assignments.

- I will issue all progress reports and teacher communications to my parents and family members in a timely manner so they understand my progress.
- I will read at least 30 minutes per day and record my time on the reading logs.
- I will make sure that my parents receive school correspondence.
